Dinosaur and mammal digs in the scenic and rugged North Dakota badlands near Bismarck

Visit fossil sites near Bismarck, North Dakota; thirty million-year-old sites containing sabertooth cats, rhinos, ancient dogs, and other mammals, or sixty-five million-year-old sites containing dinosaurs, crocodiles, plants, turtles, and more. The North Dakota Geological Survey will sponsor scientific, professionally conducted fossil prospecting and excavations at these sites in July, 2011. Public participation is invited.
