Prehistoric sea creature dig at the Pembina Gorge site, North Dakota

An 80-million-year-old fossil site containing mosasaur (giant sea lizards), bird, fish, squid, and other fossils is being excavated at the Pembina Gorge site near Walhalla. The North Dakota Geological Survey, North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department, and Walhalla Economic Development will co-sponsor a scientific, professionally conducted fossil excavation at the site in July 2012. Public participation is invited; open to anyone 15 years or older**.
