Crocodile fossil dig in the scenic and rugged North Dakota badlands at the Whiskey Creek site

A 60-million-year-old fossil site containing crocodile, champsosaur (crocodile-like animal), turtle, and fish fossils is being excavated in the beautiful and rugged badlands at the Whiskey Creek site near Buffalo Gap, North Dakota. The North Dakota Geological Survey, in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service - Dakota Prairie Grasslands, will conduct scientific, professionally administered fossil excavations at this site in August 2012. Public participation is invited; open to anyone 15 years or older.
