Dinosaur and other fossil digs in the scenic and rugged North Dakota badlands near Marmarth

Sixty-five- to 75-million-year-old fossil sites containing dinosaur and other fossils are being excavated in the beautiful and rugged badlands near Marmarth, North Dakota. The North Dakota Geological Survey and the Marmarth Research Foundation, in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service - Dakota Prairie Grasslands, will conduct scientific, professionally administered, fossil excavations at these sites in June 2012.
