

# Public Fossil Dig - Pembina

-This dig is co-sponsored by the North Dakota Geological Survey, North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department, and Walhalla Economic Development. We will be returning once again to the beautifully scenic Pembina Gorge in our ongoing search for sea monsters. This Pierre Formation location, 80 million years old, holds some of the oldest surface rocks in North Dakota. This was a time when North Dakota was covered with the Western Interior Seaway, and was home to great swimming reptiles called mosasaurs, giant squid, sea turtles, aquatic birds, large (and small) fish, snails, clams, and more. These past few years we have been slowly uncovering the partial skeleton of a Mosasaur, and hope to find more yet.

-When: July 20th - 26th, 2015

-Where: Near Walhalla, Cavalier County
