 Landslide Deposits

Variable mixture of strata and deposits that have slid or slumped to the base of steep slopes principally by gravity. Ground surface of many landslide deposits is characterized by hummocky topography, numerous arcuate scarps, and chaotic bedding. Locally includes hillslopes affected by creep and hillslope material transported by debris flows.



Geologic Symbols
