RECOVERY PROJECT" FOR THE PURPOSE OF
ACQUIRING THE TAX REDUCTIONS PROVIDED BY
NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE CHAPTER 57-
51.1 AND SUCH OTHER AND FURTHER RELIEF AS
THE COMMISSION MAY DEEM APPROPRIATE.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

Pursuant to legal notice this cause came on for hearing at 9:00 a.m.
on the 25th day of September, 1991, in Bismarck, North Dakota, before an
examiner appointed by the Industrial Commission of North Dakota, hereinafter
referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this 11th day of March, 1992, the Commission, a quorum
being present, having considered the testimony adduced and the exhibits
received at said hearing, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the
Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That Section 38-08-11 of the North Dakota Century Code ("NDCC")
provides that the Commission shall enter its orders within thirty (30) days
after hearing.

(3) That due to the absence of administrative rules implementing tax
incentives provided in Chapter 57-51.1 of the NDCC, additional time is
necessary for the Commission to render a decision in this matter; therefore,
this matter should be continued.

(4) That Commission rules relating to the tax incentive provided by
Chapter 57-51.1 NDCC will be effective on or before the 1st day of May,
1992.

(5) That applicant needs to present additional data in this matter.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That this matter is hereby continued to the regularly scheduled
hearing on May 27, 1992.
