#### ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

#### BY THE COMMISSION:

Pursuant to legal notice this cause came on for hearing on the 16th day of May, 1974, at Bismarck, North Dakota, before the Industrial Commission of North Dakota, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this  $31^{\frac{5+}{2}}$  day of  $31^{\frac{5+}{2}}$  day of  $31^{\frac{5+}{2}}$ , 1974, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony adduced, and the exhibits received at said hearing, and being fully advised in the premises,

#### FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given, as required by law, that personal notice having been given Earl Schwartz by certified mail, return receipt requested, and despite the fact Earl Schwartz failed to appear at said hearing, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That Earl Schwartz dba Gofor Oil, Inc., and Earl Schwartz Company, is the operator of the following wells in Mohall Field, Bottineau County, North Dakota:

(3) That Rule 314 of the Commission provides that after October 1, 1970, all surface pits or containers for the disposal of saltwater liquids or brines produced with oil and natural gas which have not been inspected and approved by the office of the State Geologist and assigned a permit number, were to be emptied and leveled or removed. The rule further provides that at no time shall salt water liquids or brines be allowed to flow over the surface of the land or into

streams.

- (4) That Rule 5 of the Commission requires all operators to conduct their operations in a manner that will prevent waste of oil and gas and shall not allow either oil or gas to leak or escape from a natural reservoir, or from wells, tanks, containers, pipe or other storage conduit or operating equipment.
- (5) That Rule 310 of the Commission provides that oil shall not be stored or retained in earther reservoirs, or in open receptables.

- (10) That Earl Schwartz has been notified several times, both orally and in writing, by the office of the State Geologist and its personnel, that such violations did exist.
  - (11) That despite such notices Earl Schwartz continued to produce said wells.
- (12) That based upon such facts the Commission finds Earl Schwartz to be in violation of Rule 5, Rule 310, and Rule 314 of the Commission in the operation of the above-named wells.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That Earl Schwartz, dba Gofor Oil, Inc., and Earl Schwartz Company, be and is hereby directed, to immediately shut-in and cease production from the following wells for failure to comply with the provisions of Commission Rules 5, 310, and 314, to wit:

- (2) That this order is to remain in effect unless and until said wells meet the requirements of Commission Rule 314 and Rule 310 and corrective measures taken to prevent violations of Rule 5.
- (3) That when all wells listed above are in compliance with the rules, Earl Schwartz may make application to the Commission for an order permitting him to resume production from said wells.
- (4) That failure to comply with the provisions of this Order will be considered sufficient grounds for the Commission to institute proceedings in district court, as provided in Section 38-08-16 and 38-08-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, including, but not limited to, the penalty of not more than one thousand (1000) dollars for each day of violation and such prohibitory or mandatory injunction as the facts may warrant.

Dear Mr. Schwartz:

An inspection of your oil leases in the Moball Field was made on April 26, 1974 by this Department and the Morth Onkota Coological Survey. At the time of this inspection numerous wells in the Moball Field had spills which flowed onto adjacent cultivated fields and also onto surface water in the area. This is in violation of Regulation 61-28 and the 1972 Amendments to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, Public Law 92-500. Failure to report these spills is also in violation of the Federal Law.

These spills shall be cleaned up and all spills in the future shall be reported to this office by calling 224-2375 or legal action may be taken.

Gentlemen:

In reply to your notice of May 2, 1974, and also in regard to the hearing to show cause for the Mohall Field. First, I have been working all I can to clean up but the weather has been against us all winter. We have had the most snow in the area from north of Minot all along the Canadian border. The snow around the well sites was from 5 to 10 ft. banks and about all water, which left all sites wet and you may say, all that was water. The weather has been so cold the oil will not burn and you can not get out there with wheel tractors.

In short, you people should know if you can not farm, you can not do much for clean up. We were over last fall and pushed all the pits in we could.

The way it sets now, if I had not tried, you would have some reason to complain.

Now for the work done to May 13th.

The No. 1 Gehringer is all cleaned up.

The No. 2 Gehringer, we have the oil burned, but in between the pipe line and thak & treator, there is a small area south of the tank that had a leak and this I may explain and the oil went under the snow for some time. It could have been for 3 or 4 days before it was noticed. When the snow melted it was a mess and this has not been cleaned yet as the roads are so soft, you cannot haul any loads and cannot get the cat across the river. It is also too wet to get a truck in with gravel to cover what we have left to do.

The Mohall Park well is all cleaned up. I pumped the pit outabout six weeks or 2 months ago but could not get the oil on the pit warmed to skim odd and when the snow melted, it raised the water again. Now, I have again pumped it off but cannot get a hot oil truck to heat it. Yesterday the 13th, we could get one and then had a snow storm. The wind was wrong, so again could not work. We had a very wet snow and now it is too wet again. I don't like to burn this oof as it should be salvaged. I don't know where the oil came fro but think it came from the Monsanto Ring well. This is the second time this has happened. As soon as we can clean the oil off the pit and get the cat across the Mouse river we will fill the pits.

The Carl Gilseth, I cleaned the location myself on the 26th, of April. The salt water line again plugged up and made a small spill. Not much oil, but it went out the gas line vent. I again cleaned it on May 8th and again dug out and it plugged on May 10th and sprayed the road by the treater. The line broke last winter and production Service dug it out and repaired it and Amerada laid a cement line in here which is hard to repair and at that time, there must have been some small gravel or stones in the line. Each time, this is what plugged the line. Now we have it dug out waiting for a truck to pump it out again. I do not have this last mess cleaned up yet. The pit is still too wet to do anything with and will be for at least six weeks.

The Gilseth which is operated by GOFOR had a leak in the flow line and ran under the snow and the oil is between the high line pole and the treater and cannot be burned. This again should be heated and sucked off so we are in the same shape as I have spoke of in the Mohall Park pit. This is the only spill or dirt on the site. Now the pits are very wet. The water is fresh and I don not know where we could get any dirt to fill them. The well was dug in a slough in the first place. At that time, I moved the stake 125 ft. and Vern Lund said we could not do this so we called Laird and so had to move it back in the slough. Then all the dirt was used to build up around the well and tanks. This is a large low flat and the farmer would not let you take any dirt to fill these pits. I sure don't know the answer and anyway, there is no salt in them. I can't honestly call them salt water pits. Maybe Mr. Kalstead has taken samples of the water, but I have tasted the water and does not seem salty to me.

The Rhoda Racke #1 is still too wet in the field to clean and cannot do the balance.

The Rouse #1 is cleaned up. There is no pit on this lease. Perhaps, Mr. Kalstead thought this small water hole was a pit. This is wrong as we finished the pit last fall. I can however, when it drys up, drain this water out to the north and I perhaps should, as it would look a lot better and not show up as an old pit.

The Simpson #2 is connected with the salt water line to the Amerada Gilseth, so we have the same trouble as we had on the Gilseth.

The George Shurson has partially been cleaned up. The pit is salty and is still very large. We filled a large area last fall and I think we should get the rest in about six weeks if it ever quits raining and snowing in this area.

The Witteman well and oil tanks are clean but the disposal tank and pump is covered with oil. This is the same as the Park pit. It should be heated and sucked off, so we are still in a bind for the hot oil truck and the wind in the right direction. The old salt water pit is partly filled.

We did all we could last fall and again hope this could be completed in a short time. Now this is about the complete story on the whole field. I will not come down to the hearing, as I always feel so bad when I come back home. It has never done any good for me to come down there. Perhaps, you folks do not agree with me, but this is right. I have been doing the best I can and you want to remember that every year, your equipment gets older and you have more trouble. However, I have another man coming from Nebraska next month and hope he will be better than the one I have. I have not been able to find anyone before and Mr. Michels from Production Service was over and worked and also could not pump them. It seems that people do not want to work any more, but they sure like the gasoline for their cars.

Well, I am signing off and you do as you wish. Please drop me a line as to your decision. I hope you understand how I feel.

Dear Mr. Noble:

I am enclosing two more copies of logs for the Gudvangen salt water well showing the perforated section. We had not received them yet and I forgot about it later.

I received your letter today in regard to clean up. We are still unable to work around most of the wells due to the wet weather. We have done a lot of work in the Grano Field and I have enclosed tickets for some of the wells that have been worked on. With the amount of snow we had this winter and the water to contend with, I hauled all the water out of the Mohall Park pit and when the snow melted, it was half full again. This is fresh water that came, also on the Shurson, salt water pit. All of these sites are too wet to work on as you people shoud know. If you think Minot had water, where do you think it came from? The farmers are not in the field yet to prove how wet it is and may not be for at leaset another week. When you spend \$2,000.00 to \$3,000.00 a month for snow plowing, you can realize how high the snow was around the wells. You will note we have had crews working from the 9th of April and are still at it. I have been doing the best we can in all fields and have problems last year in Burke County, and all the work was done. I ended up with a broken leg over this which was all unnecessary . All any one can do is the best. If you can do better, please tell me how so I can improve. All roads are too soft to do any hauling of any kind and will be for at least three more weeks. Also, there has been no salt water run in any pits in any of the fields where pits have not been permitted.

In the case of the Wiley Field, the farmer wants the area restored so farming practices can be resumed.

The saltwater pit at the Mohall Park #1 is completely oil covered. There is some suspicion that the saltwater and crude oil is getting into the west Cutbank Creek. If this is so, then the Health Department and the Game and Fish Department will need to be notified.

I received a call from Jim Bell September 27, 1973, about a spill at the Reignam #1, Glenburn Field. I advised him at the time to send a report to the Health Department and the North Dakota Geological Survey and to start cleaning at up immediately.

As of today, there has been no clean-up. This matter has been brought to the attention of the Health Department.

If the work is not accomplished within two weeks on the Mohall Park #1 and the Reiquam #1, this office will request an order from the North Dakota Industrial Commission to shut in the wells.

I have compiled a list of leases that will require some attention by the fall.

I realize if the leases are too muddy this work cannot be accomplished and will have to be delayed until a more favorable time.

MOHALL FIELD

Mohall Park #1-NE SW 31-162N-83W. Pits located on the edge of West Cut

Bakk Creek. Any spills could end up in the Souris River. This pit should be
leveled.

Carl Gilseth #1-SW SW 5-161N-83W. There has been more than necessary land damage from salt water escaping from this pit. This pit should be leveled.

George Shurson et al #1-SW SW 6-161N-83W. Pits need further leveling. About 20% leveling was accomplished in the fall of 1971.

George Witteman #1A-NE NE 7-161N-83W. About 50% of the pit has been pushed in, but will need to be finished.

NORTH GRANO FIELD

M. C. Davison #1-NW NE 30-160N-84W. Pit about 25% pushed in in fall of 9971. Needs to be leveled.

PRATT FIELD

Herdt Estate #1-NE SE 6-158N-80W. This pit has been 60% leveled. The rest still should be accomplished by this fall.

Kitzman-BND #2-SW NW 5-158N-80W. This pit 65% leveled in the fall of 1971. The remainder should be leveled by the fall of 1973.

Norsby #1-SW SW 5-158N-80W. This pit 50% leveled in the fall of 1971. The remainder should be leveled by this fall.

#### Gentlemen:

On or about the latter part of May, 1973, an oil spill was noted around Mohall Park District well operated by Earl Schwarts Company of Kenmare, North Dakota. On June 2, 1973, the area experienced a heavy rain causing the pit to overflow. This caused the oil spill which seems to have come from the area of the recirculating pump hear the treator to contaminate an area of approximately 25 feet in diameter around the treator and then flowed approximately 200 feet east to the well head. This condition was noted by an inspector of the State Geological Survey on or about June 20, 1973. On that date the pumper, Don Helmers, was notified and instructed to notify Earl Schwartz of these damages.

On July 19, 1973, the inspector from the Geoligical Survey, again, checked the area and no action to remedy these conditions had yet been taken.

This condition has caused and is continuing to result in damages to the trees and surrounding vegetation on the golf course. Apparently the pit that overflowed contained a high concentration of salt as well as oil causing further damage of almost a permanent nature to the vegetation. Purther delay in proper maintenance will result in further damages.

Box 853 Kammare, North Dakota 58746 Dear Mr. Schwartz: This Department has received a letter from the North Dakota Geological Survey regarding the lack of cleanup of an oil spill in which the City of Mohall Park Board is involved. Apparently, this oil spill occured sometime in May of 1973 and was still emident on July 19, 1973. This Department was notified of this spill by Mr. Kenneth Exclasted of the North Dakota Geological Survey. For your information the following is quoted from Public Law 92500 which became effective October 18, 1972. The section reads as follows: " (5) Any person in charge of a vessel or of an on-shore facility or an off-shore facility shall, as soon as he has knowledge of any discharge of oil or a hazardous substance from such vessel or facility in violation of Paragraph (3) of this subsection, immediately notify the appropriate agency of the United States Government of such discharge. Any such person the fails to notify immediately such agency of such discharge shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.

Motification received pursuant to this paragraph or information obtained by the exploitation of such notification shall not be used against any such person in any criminal case, except a prosecution for perjury or for giving a false statement."

Further, the Act provides that where a person fails to properly clean up after any such oil spill, the United States Government, through the Environmental Protection Agency or through action by the appropriate State Agency, may cause such cleanup to be completed by whatever force is necessary and such costs of cleanup shall be

tharged back to the person or company. This Department recommends that a complete eleanup operation be conducted of this site immediately. Further, this Department advises that all future oil or heserdous metagial spills be reported to the Houth Debota State Department of Health and the Environmental Protection Agency immediately.

Two piles of sand had been delivered but never spread. Oil has run east and circled the dike area around the well head. I first notice this spill June 20, 1973 and at that time informed your pumper. I also advised him to call you and to contact the Health Department. In talking to the members of the Park Board they informed me this spill was there the last week of May. Even though this well was shut-in, periodic checks should be made. Oil spills are to be cleaned up immediately. The heavy rains of early June have now carried crude oil out of the diked area.
