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Bridger Pipeline LLC Announces extension of Binding Open Season for the Proposed 80-mile Extension of its North Dakota System

Due to shippers' requests, Bridger Pipeline LLC announced today it will extend its open season for pipeline capacity on the proposed project to extend its North Dakota crude oil pipeline transportation system. The binding open season closing date has been extended from April 15 to April 30, 2010 to allow interested parties additional time to evaluate the project. The open season will provide an opportunity for potential shippers to make long-term volume commitments in exchange for a discounted rate for the transportation of light sweet crude from an origin near the town of Four Bears, North Dakota to Belle Fourche Pipeline's Treetop Station and Alexander Station, and to Bridger Pipeline's Fryburg Station, the origin of Bridger's Little Missouri Pipeline. In addition, due to the expected large volumes of crude production, Bridger has decided to increase the diameter of its pipeline to a twelve inch nominal diameter, which will allow for increased operational flexibility and, more importantly, increased capacity.

Each shipper desiring long-term transportation service in this area is requested to execute and submit a completed and signed Throughput and Deficiency Agreement (T&D) to Bridger Pipeline LLC by April 30, 2010. A copy of the T&D, along with all other open season documents for this project, may be obtained by contacting Jason Secor.

The Open Season seeks binding shipper commitments for the transportation of specified volumes of crude oil over a 5-year term from the Four Bears origin point to Treetop Station, Alexander Station, and Fryburg Station destination points. Provided there is adequate shipper support and pending regulatory approvals, the new extension of Bridger Pipeline LLC's system is targeted to be in service during the first quarter of 2011 with an expected initial capacity of 60,000 barrels per day. Bridger Pipeline LLC currently owns and operates pipeline systems throughout Wyoming, Montana and North Dakota.
